**1. Discussion and Possible Action on the Recommendations on the License Lists:**

**A) New and Renewal Operator's (Bartender's) Licenses.**

**i) Association of Downtown Businesses, 1245 Main St. Suite 200, Harvest Fest on September 16 & 17, 2011 at the downtown square.**

**ii) St. Stanislaus Holy Name Society, 838 Fremont St, for St. Stanislaus Holy Name Steak Feed on August 9, 2011 at Bukolt Park Lodge.**

**C) Class "B" Fermented Malt Beverage and Class "C" Wine for Lois Henke and Terrence Check for Cozy Kitchen, 1338 Third Street, for license period beginning July 19, 2011.**

Ald. Trzebiatowski **moved**, Ald. Wiza seconded, to approve the new and renewal Operator's (Bartender's) Licenses, Special Class "B" Retailer's Licenses for the Association of Downtown Businesses, 1245 Main St. Suite 200, for the Harvest Fest on September 16 & 17, 2011, St. Stanislaus Holy Name Society, 838 Fremont St, for St. Stanislaus Holy Name Steak Feed on August 9, 2011, and the Class "B" Fermented Malt Beverage and Class "C" Wine for Lois Henke and Terrence Check for Cozy Kitchen, 1338 Third Street, for license period beginning July 19, 2011.

Ayes, all; nays, none; motion carried.

**D) Temporary Extension of Licensed Premise:**

**i) Jason J. Glisczynski, 1920 Adams Street, Plover, WI at Player's Lounge, 2124 Rice Street, Temporary extension of licensed premise to include the sports center area for special events on July 23, September 10, October 1, October 15, October 22, November 11, 2011.**

Director Ostrowski said the requests were denied at the Plan Commission meeting. He said there were concerns from the neighboring property owners that this establishment is turning into more of a tavern.

Ald. R. Stroik asked if the Public Protection Committee should even consider these requests since they were denied at the Plan Commission meeting.

City Attorney Molepske replied the Committee can do as they choose.

Ald. Trzebiatowski questioned the hours of operation and he noticed that the request for the outside event was not on the agenda.

Ald. R. Stroik said the request for the outdoor event was not placed on the agenda because the agreement that Mr. Glisczynski has with the property owner does not allow for the use of alcohol beverages.

Director Ostrowski noted the agreement that Mr. Glisczynski has with the property owner only allows for parking.

Ald. Trzebiatowski asked if there is anything on this agenda item that does not comply with what the Committee has the ability to take care of.

Director Ostrowski replied that interior events have been approved in the past.

Ald. R. Stroik noted that all the interior events were denied by the Plan Commission.

Ald. Wiza does not feel it is the City's concern that Mr. Glisczynski does not have an agreement with the other landowner.

City Attorney Molepske said it is state law to advise the property owner and get permission before holding an event such as this.

Ald. Wiza asked why the Plan Commission denied these requests if there were no complaints in the past.

Mayor Halverson said there were concerns from a neighboring property owners regarding noise, vandalism and traffic. He said the concern is that this is turning into a tavern rather than a sports complex.

Ald. Wiza asked if there are any police reports regarding the neighbor's concerns.

Asst. Chief Skibba said there have been some concerns of noise and vandalism in the past but nothing recent.

LeRoy Cordy, 2157 Rice Street, submitted a document of incidents at 2124 Rice Street and it was placed on file. He voiced his concerns on disorderly behavior of patrons, noise and litter.

Jason Gliszynski, 1920 Adams Street, addressed some of Mr. Cordy's concerns. He said if Mr. Cordy is having issues, he should contact the Police Department when they are occurring. Mr. Gliszynski reiterated that events have been held in the past with no issues. He also noted that the outdoor event on August 20, 2011 is being withdrawn.

Ald. Brooks said he has talked with the neighbors in the past and most of them are pleased with Mr. Gliszynski as a neighbor. He said vandalism and noise have been issues in this neighborhood even before the Players Lounge was there.

Reid Rocheleau, 408 Cedar Street, said the noise may be annoying but it may not reach the level of decibels to be a violation.

Mayor Halverson reiterated that internal events have been held in the past without concerns. He said the hours of operation have been a concern in the neighborhood.

Ald. Trzebiatowski **moved**, Ald. Wiza seconded, approval of the interior special events held on July 23, September 10, October 1, October 15, October 22, and November 11, 2011 and not taking forward the request for August 20, 2011 and not taking hours of operation into consideration.

Ayes, all; nays, none; motion carried.

- ii) CP-SP Operations LLC, 1501 North Point Drive for Tilted Kilt, Timothy Mueller, Agent; request for Temporary extension of licensed premise for two events to serve alcohol in an area outside the building on July 23 and August 13, 2011.**

Asst. Chief Skibba said events were held here in the past with no problems.

Ald. Slowinski **moved**, Ald. R. Stroik seconded, approval of the request.

## **2. Consideration of Requests to Hold Event / Street Closings:**

### **A) Association of Downtown Businesses –Annual Dozynki Harvest Fest - Use of a Tent, Parking Restrictions, Closure of a Portion of Main St. on Sept. 17, 2011.**

Ald. R. Stroik stated this is an annual event.

Asst. Chief Skibba said there are no concerns with this event.

Sarah Robinson said the request was to close the street on September 16 and 17, 2011.

Ald. Wiza asked for clarification on what streets will be closed for these days.

Sarah Robinson replied just the loop around the square will be closed on Friday and Main Street starting at Strongs Avenue all the way to the end will be closed on Saturday.

Ald. Wiza asked how the Farmer's Market vendors will get in and out.

Sarah Robinson said the vendors will arrive before the event so they will not have a problem getting in. She said this still needs to be worked out but possibly a barrier could be moved to let them out.

Ald. Wiza **moved**, Ald. Slowinski seconded, approval of the street closings on Friday from Third Street to Second Street including the loop and Saturday from Strongs Avenue to Water Street during the times stated provided that the details in working with the Farmer's Market and the traffic routing are worked out before Monday and close Second Street from Clark Street to Crosby Avenue.

Ayes, all; nays, none; motion carried.

## **3. Consideration and Possible Action on Ordinance Amendment - Waiting Period for Temporary "Class B" (picnic) Beer Licenses (Section 12.14(18)).**

Clerk Moe said the length of time for the waiting period is up to the Committee to determine. He noted that the waiting period for wine licenses is 15 days.

Ald. Trzebiatowski **moved**, Ald. Slowinski seconded, approval that applicants for "Class B" (picnic) licenses must be made not less than 15 days prior to granting the license and applicants for temporary wine licenses must be made not less than 15 days as well.
