Slowinski seconded, to approve the 25 new and 75 renewal operator licenses, **Temporary Class "B" / "Class B" Retailer's License (Picnic License) for Alzheimer's Association Greater Wisconsin Chapter, 2900 Curry Lane Suite A, Green Bay, WI for Ladies Night on June 22, 2012 at Adventure 212, 3217 John Joanis Drive, Stevens Point with licensed operator on the premise being Robert Bill for wine only, temporary extension of licensed premise for Pete's Sports Bar and Grill, 200 Division Street, request for extension of licensed premise for an outdoor summer party on Saturday, July 21, 2012 to include a 60' x 60' fenced in area, "Class A" Liquor License for the Blue Top Shell, LLC, in business as Blue Top Shell, 3449 Church Street, Stevens Point with Crystal Fletcher as agent for license period beginning 07/01/12.**

Ald. Trzebiatowski questioned why a map of the extension of premise **for Pete's Sports Bar** was not included in the packet.

Ald. R. Stroik noted this is an event that has been held in the past.

Chief Ruder said the Police Department does not have any problems with this request.

E. Consideration of "Class B" Retail Fermented Malt Beverage and Intoxicating Liquor

License:

- 1) Kathleen Konkol for Archie's Bar & Grill, 2317 Division Street, Stevens Point for license period beginning 07/01/12. (New)**

Chief Ruder stated the Police Department does not have any concerns with this request.

Ald. Slowinski **moved**, Ald. M. Stroik seconded, approval of the "Class B" Retail Fermented Malt Beverage and Intoxicating Liquor License for Kathleen Konkol for Archie's Bar & Grill, 2317 Division Street, Stevens Point for license period beginning July 1, 2012.

Call for the vote: Ayes, all; nays, none; motion carried.

- 2) Jason J. Glisczynski for Player's Lounge, 2124 Rice Street, Stevens Point for license period beginning 07/01/12. (Renewal)**

Chief Ruder said the Plan Commission determined to only do a six month renewal of the conditional use permit for the Player's Lounge.

Ald. Wiza **moved**, Ald. M. Stroik seconded, to approve the renewal of the license for one year.

Ald. Wiza said he understands that if Mr. Glisczynski does not have a conditional use permit then he cannot operate the tavern.

City Attorney Molepske said usually a six month conditional use runs along with a six month liquor license.

Ald. Wiza asked if there is no conditional use permit after six months, Mr. Glisczynski would not be able to operate the tavern.

City Attorney Molepske replied that is correct.

Ald. Wiza said it makes sense to keep this license with the same renewal dates as all the other liquor licenses.

City Attorney Molepske said in six months there will be a determination of the conditional use permit so at that time the liquor license could be dealt with as well.

Mayor Halverson said if the conditions are not met and the conditional use permit expires, there would be an outstanding liquor license for a period of time until the Council would revoke the license or the license would expire.

Ald. R. Stroik prefers a six month license to go along with the six month conditional use.

Ald. Trzebiatowski favors a six month license.

Ald. Wiza asked if there are any outstanding conditions.

Director Ostrowski said all conditions have been met at this time.

Ald. Trzebiatowski asked how many conditions have been modified.

Director Ostrowski said Mr. Glisczynski has been before the Plan Commission numerous times.

Casey Davis, 917 Fifth Avenue, stated Mr. Glisczynski has done a lot of good things including holding benefits.

Jason Glisczynski said he does not disagree with a six month license but asked if there will be any additional fees with a six month license.

City Attorney Molepske said consistency is very important.

Ald. Wiza **moved**, Ald. M. Stroik seconded, to amend the motion to approve the renewal of a six month **license for Player's Lounge**.

Ald. R. Stroik stated the motion is for a six month renewal for a license period beginning July 1, 2012.

Barb Jacobs, 1616 Depot Street, asked what the cost will be for his license.

Clerk Moe replied it will be \$250 for six months.

Ald. R. Stroik said he was questioned by some business owners why the City is even considering the renewal of this license because of past delinquent taxes. He assured the citizens that the delinquent payments are being dealt with.

Ald. Trzebiatowski **moved**, Ald. Wiza seconded, to approve the request to hold an event / street closings for the Association of Downtown Businesses, annual July 4 parade at noon on July 4, 2012 with the request for closure of Main Street from Rogers Street to Water Street and parking restriction and the request of Stevens Point Area YMCA, Annual Lactic Edge Triathlon on July 14, 2012 and the request of partial closures of Crosby Ave. and Forest St.

Call for the vote: Ayes, all; nays, none; motion carried.

3. Discussion on Food Vending Carts on City Property.

Mayor Halverson said he had conversations with the owners of Politos, Square Scoops, Graffitis, and K. Bueno. He said all of these businesses oppose any type of food vending carts in the downtown area at any time. The Mayor agrees that the food vending carts pay a minimal fee and take business away from our local businesses.

Ald. Beveridge pointed out a possible grammatical error in the city ordinance relating to this issue.

Ald. Patton asked if ice-cream carts are also included.

Ald. Wiza said he disagrees with the points raised. He stated the City should not decide who can or cannot compete with our businesses.

Andrea Patrizi, Las Vegas, said she is considering starting a food vending cart in Stevens Point. She said the carts are a good business to bring in revenue to the City.

Ald. Moore reminded everyone to not just think of the downtown area. He noted there are other events in other areas of the City.

Ald. Suomi said it is a drastic change to completely revoke food vending carts in the City.

Barb Jacobs, 1616 Depot Street, said food vending carts and restaurants are completely different.

Ald. R. Stroik suggested looking at amending the fee structure for food vending carts.

4. Monthly Inspection Report.
