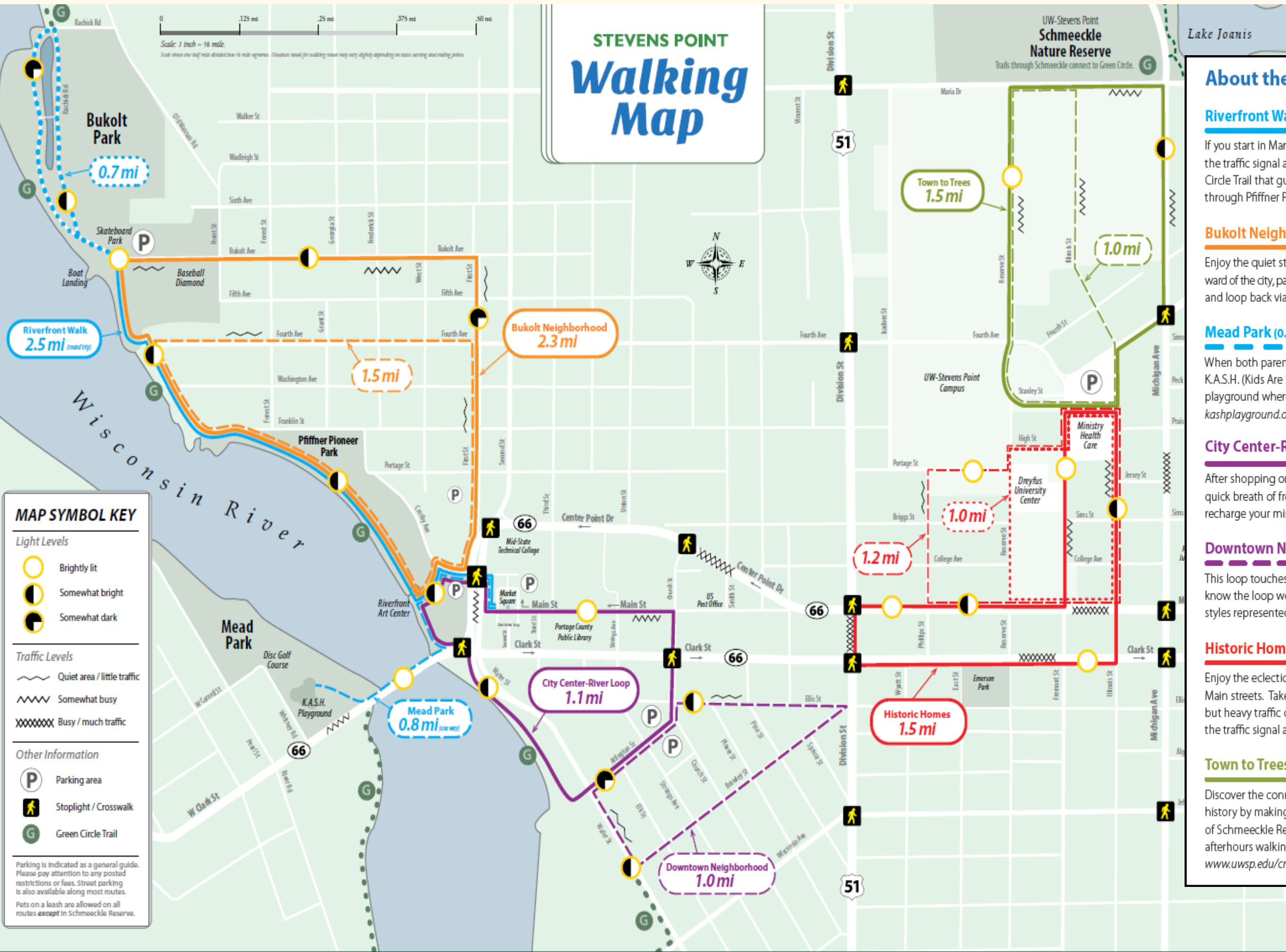


STEVENS POINT Walking Map

Parking is indicated as a general guide. Please pay attention to any posted restrictions or fees. Street parking is also available along most routes. Pets on a leash are allowed on all routes except in Schmeckle Reserve.

About the Walking Routes

Riverfront Walk (2.5 mi—round trip)

If you start in Market Square downtown, take advantage of the traffic signal at Crosby and HWY 66 to find the Green Circle Trail that guides you along the Wisconsin River through Pfiffner Pioneer and Bukolt Parks.

Bukolt Neighborhood (2.3 mi)

Enjoy the quiet streets of what was once the Polish fourth ward of the city, past the oldest Polish church in the county and loop back via the Green Circle Trail.

Mead Park (0.8 mi—one way)

When both parents need to get outside, head over to K.A.S.H. (Kids Are Special Here) Playground, an accessible playground where children of all abilities can play together. kashplayground.org

City Center-River Loop (1.1 mi)

After shopping or dining downtown, this loop offers a quick breath of fresh air along the riverfront. Or use it to recharge your mind and body for the rest of the workday.

Downtown Neighborhood (1.0 mi)

This loop touches several noted historic districts. Once you know the loop well, explore the different architectural styles represented among the many side streets.

Historic Homes (1.5 mi)

Enjoy the eclectic mix of majestic homes along Clark and Main streets. Take care crossing the streets, intermittent but heavy traffic occurs along this route. Take advantage of the traffic signal at Division Street.

Town to Trees (1.5 mi)

Discover the connection to Wisconsin's conservation history by making your way across campus to the entrance of Schmeckle Reserve. This is the best lighted route for afterhours walking. The Schmeckle trail map is online at www.uwsp.edu/cnr-ap/schmeckle/Pages/visit/map.aspx.
