The Smongeski Health Fund has been operated through the City Clerk's office for the past 35 years. The following statistics cover the period from August 1, 2015 through July 31, 2016.

The Fund currently has over 80 families signed up for assistance in addition to providing financial support to other programs such as Healthy Smiles, Maternal and Child Health and Project Fresh Start programs.

There was a decline from last year with the distribution of vitamins and toothbrushes. This may have been a result of several factors including that we eliminated paying for gummy vitamins and a mix up with Shopko staff. As you may remember, gummy vitamins are cost prohibitive and there was a misunderstanding with some Shopko staff regarding procedure which resulted in several people being turned away. To address the current situation, we will be sending reminders to participants in the spring reintroducing them to the Fund and the services we provide.

The number of students receiving sealants through Healthy Smiles increased this year as the program expanded to include 6<sup>th</sup> grade students up to the age of 14 and targeted 2<sup>nd</sup> permanent molars. The Fund covered the cost of sealants for 61 students with 225 sealants this year. Last year we assisted with 45 students and 163 sealants. We did not have any costs for sealants payable directly to a dentist this year.

The Fund did not receive a request for assistance with eyeglasses this year.
