- SPFD's partnership with UWSP and Stevens Point Police continues to expand with an Active Shooter Presentation sponsored by two student organizations: SLEA (Student Law Enforcement Association) and Student Veterans of America
- Virtual dementia training: The Aging and Disability Resource Center of Portage County and their Dementia Care team came to SPFD to give virtual dementia training to SPFD crews. Each participant completed the virtual dementia tasks and attended a debriefing with a dementia care specialist to talk about the experience.
- Refresher training: Adult Protective Services provided refresher training on "Emergency Placement/Holds" and the importance of having a Power of Attorney properly filled out.
