5. Presentation by Lynn Markham regarding Eco-Municipality Anniversary.

Anna Haines gave a brief presentation on behalf of Lynn Markham regarding the first Eco-Municipality anniversary for the City of Stevens Point and the steps taken toward sustainability. Ms. Haines invited everyone to Kristin's Riverwalk to help celebrate the anniversary.

Eric Olson, 1317 Wisconsin Street, stated the City as well as homeowners need to continue to be involved in sustainability.

Susan Ermer-Schuller, 209 Fourth Avenue, spoke in support of the City as an Eco-Municipality. She urged the City to continue their efforts in the future.

Rev. Susan Zencka, 1300 Main Street, supports the City as an Eco-Municipality and the accomplishments the City has achieved.

Bill Ebert, 216 Franklin Street, spoke in support of the neighborhood gardens within the City and the usage of rain barrels to help conserve water.

Cathy Dugan, 615 Sommers Street, congratulated the City for their efforts as an Eco-Municipality.

Jeremy Solin, 1417 Rogers Street, spoke on behalf of Farmshed and the importance of buying local foods. He stated they may also be interested in the vacant greenhouse within the City.

Brian Hoving, 1582 Church Street, registered in favor but did not wish to speak.

Mayor Halverson congratulated everyone who participated in Eco-Municipality Task Force, public forums and subcommittees.

Mark A. Nook, 2308 Eagle Summit, is the interim Chancellor and introduced himself to the Mayor and Council. He is happy to be involved with such a warm community.

Bobbi Bradley, 3908 Lorraine Street, asked that the City reconsider the ditching project in the Lorraine Street area.

Thomas Carne, 3901 Lorraine Street, opposes the ditching project. He voiced his concerns on safety of the children, parking and standing water in the ditch.

Duane Groshek, 3624 Lorraine Street, understands the need for ditching but feels the project is too drastic.

Francis Kuhls, 3617 Lorraine Street, is against the ditching project. He has never seen problems with water on Lorraine Street.

Mark Ilten, 3701 Lorraine Street, submitted a petition against the ditching project and it was placed on file. He voiced his concerns on the little notice given to the property owners.

Louise Johnson, 1008 Sunset Blvd., opposes the ditching project and she is upset with the little notice about the project.

Glen Graham, 3608 Lorraine Street, is against the ditching project. He is concerned with safety and parking.

Reid Rocheleau, 408 Cedar Street, is concerned that Mayor Halverson's comments about the dog park being temporary will hurt the fund raising efforts. He is also concerned that the Mayor is taking on too much authority.

Faye Volk, 3916 Lorraine Street, is against the ditching project. She said it is costing the City money to fix a problem that does not exist.

David Ozsvath, 3909 Lorraine Street, said this is not the best solution.

Clerk Moe explained why the resolution is needed. He said it is important to get an accurate population count for determining state aid, grants and establishing congressional, state legislative and local boundaries.

Ald. Wiza asked how much the duties of this committee will cost.

Clerk Moe replied it is completely voluntary. He said there is some funding for the materials that will be used.

Reid Rocheleau, 408 Cedar Street, voiced his concerns on why the dam was built higher and the fairness to all the property owners within the floodplain.

As no one further wished to speak, the Mayor declared the public hearing closed.

Ald. O'Meara moved, Ald. Slowinski seconded, approval of the amendment to the Floodplain Ordinance.

Ald. O'Meara said the reason for the amendments is so that the City is in compliance with the federal floodplain insurance regulations.

Ald. Wiza asked if the updated maps are available and if there are any significant changes to District 4 or District 9.

Director Gardner said the maps are available on-line. He said there are not a lot of changes other than along the pond.

Brenda LaBarge, 401 Sixth Avenue, stated she is a single mother who needs her bartender license to keep her job. She asked the Council to reconsider the decision made by the Public Protection Committee. Ms. LaBarge is even willing to be put on a probationary period in order to keep her livelihood for her family.

Reid Rocheleau, 408 Cedar Street, does not see the value in having these people appear before the Committee and Council. He said the Council members are judging these people with higher standards than they have. Mr. Rocheleau said the rejection process is all wrong.

Ald. Slowinski asked if the applicant was aware that an OWI would affect the renewal of her license.

Clerk Moe replied that is correct.

Ald. Slowinski moved, Ald. Brooks seconded, approval of the minutes and actions taken at the Public Protection Committee meeting of June 8, 2009.

14. Consideration of minutes and actions taken at the Board of Public Works meeting of June 8, 2009.

Ald. O'Meara moved, Ald. Wiza seconded, approval of the minutes and actions taken at the Board of Public Works meeting of June 8, 2009, with items #7, 9 and 10 pulled for further discussion.

Item #7 - Contract with Bushman Electric for electronic message board:

Ald. Wiza is concerned with spending \$25,000 for an electronic sign when other city services have already been eliminated and there are talks about possibly cutting staff. He suggested adding a pulley system for hanging banners.

Mayor Halverson said the sign will be rented out and the City will regenerate funds from it.

Ald. Heart asked how the sign will impact this already busy intersection.

Ald. Moore is concerned that this is already a congested intersection without the sign. He feels a better location is needed for the sign.

Adm. Director Morris said the sign is off the ground for better visibility. He said the sign is fixed nature with amber lights on a black background.

Director Popoff is concerned with the safety of the employees in lift trucks hanging the banners as well as the banners hanging over the road.

Ald. O'Meara feels it is a good idea to have a message sign.

Mayor Halverson said Division Street has the right amount of traffic as well as the right traffic needed for the sign.

Ald. Wiza asked how many groups are interested in the usage of this sign.

Mayor Halverson said they are using the numbers from the banners.

Ald. Wiza said in order to make a profit, we will need more than the number of banners.

Mayor Halverson replied approximately two times the amount of banners.

Ald. Wiza asked if the maintenance costs have been determined.

Mayor Halverson said there will be very little maintenance costs because of the style of message board.

Ald. Wiza moved, Ald. Slowinski seconded, to deny awarding the bid for the sign in front of the Fire Department.

Ald. Wiza asked if this requires a 2/3 majority vote.

City Attorney Molepske said there is money in the budget so a simple majority vote is all that is needed.

Ald. Mallison said this is a great tool to have.

Ald. Moore said this may be an issue that the private sector could handle and make money from it.

Item #9 - Update on the ditching project:

Ald. Wiza asked if this area has been evaluated recently to determine if the ditching is still needed.

Mayor Halverson said this has been an on-going problem for years. The Mayor stated he realized the notifications were not clear and they were not going out soon enough.

Ald. Slowinski asked how the depth of the ditch is determined.

Director Popoff said the depth is one foot down and four feet over. He stated shoulders will be added.

Mayor Halverson said dialog will continue with the property owners.

Item #10 - Director's Report:

Ald. Wiza asked why so many trees were removed and why they were taken out before the project was approved.

Mayor Halverson said the trees can be removed without Council approval.

Ald. Wiza asked if this area is part of the park.

Mayor Halverson said all the trees were removed from the Streets Facility property.

Director Popoff said as little trees as possible were removed.

Ald. Wiza is concerned that more land is being used than what is needed.

Ald. Moore moved, Ald. Wiza seconded, to place on file the minutes of the Board of Public Works for agenda items #9 and 10.

Mayor Halverson said pedestrian safety is always at the forefront.

Ald. O'Meara said a traffic control device is not put into place unless there is a problem.

Ald. Wiza asked the approximate cost of a stop sign.

Director Popoff estimated it at \$250.

Ald. Wiza does not feel a stop sign is needed southbound on First Street.

Ald. Wiza moved, Ald. Moore seconded, to place a stop sign at the intersection of First Street and Maria Drive for northbound traffic only.

GIS/Construction Manager Lemke said the Charter is a means of addressing the levels of contaminants and it is a way to show the regulatory authorities that the City is making an attempt to address the issue.

Ald. Brooks asked if the City's mercury levels are high.

GIS/Construction Manager Lemke said the mercury level is just over three and it is being changed to below two so the City is over the level.

Mayor Halverson said this will allow the City to be proactive as a department to work with the DNR and the businesses prior to the imposition of regulations.

City Attorney Molepske said these are Police and Fire Commission minutes and the contents are not approved.

Ald. Molski noted the individual still has to reside within the city if he is going to be the Fire Chief.
