Ald. Stroik moved, Ald. Hanson seconded, approval of the license list. Ayes, all; nays, none. Motion carried.

2. Request to hold Point Bock Run on Saturday, March 4, 2006, starting at noon.

Pat Leahy, Point Bock Run Co-Director, stated that the request for no parking on Henrietta Street was due to past congestion problems with the large number of participants and parked vehicles.

Capt. Ruder stated that the Police department did not have a problem with their request.

Ald. Trzebiatowski moved, Barber seconded, approval of the Point Bock Run to be held on Saturday, March 4, 2006. Ayes, all; nays, none; motion carried.

Mayor Wescott stated that the City had a record year. It surpassed any previous record for new construction and additions. \$36,892,163 in new construction and \$7,510,374 in alterations is more construction and alterations than any other municipality in the County.

The Mayor also addressed the contents of a newspaper article that was published over the weekend about a developer at odds with the City. He stated that he spoke with both the Village of Plover President and the Village Administrator who stated that they had no idea what these folks were talking about. The developers do not have six projects underway in the Village of Plover. He stated for the record, the City has had only one email from the developers since November 15, 2005 which was a short email sent to the City Attorney. The Mayor's office, the Community Development office, and the Comptroller/Treasurer's office have had no contact with the developers since early November.

Ald. Sevenich noted that on the Inspection Report there were several violations for not shoveling. She reminded the public to please shovel their sidewalks because if they do not and someone complains the property owner will be fined. It's a matter of safety this time of year.

Ald. Barber moved, Ald. Hanson seconded, approval of the Inspection Report for December 2005. Ayes, all; nays, none. Motion carried.

Chief Morris gave an update on the keg registration that will take effect on January 15, 2006. He stated that the Department has worked diligently to get ready for it and have developed a tag and are meeting with all the retailers this week. Sheriff Charewicz has met with both the Village of Park Ridge and the Town of Hull boards and he indicated that he got a favorable reception from them. The Sheriff is also planning to meet with the Village of Plover later this month.
