1. Recommendation on License List.

Director Gardner stated that the Plan Commission earlier in the day met and recommended approval of the request for expansion of premises for Clark Place, but that there was discussion over the use of music on the deck.

Tom Marks, co-owner for Clark Place, stated that the music would be more like ambiance like that of Clear Water Harbor in Waupaca and the level would be no more than traffic noise.

Director Gardner stated that other businesses in close proximity of residences there is an 11:00 p.m. cut-off for outside music.

Chief Morris stated the Police Department would prefer a cut-off time of 11:00 p.m. to be consistent with other businesses.

Ald. Barber moved, Ald. Hanson seconded, approval of the license list with an 11:00 p.m. cut off for music on the outside deck of Clark Place. Ayes, all; nays, none. Motion carried.

Ald. Trzebiatowski asked if there was going to be a confined area for the sampling.

Jami Gebert, Main Street Manager, Assoc. of Downtown Businesses, stated that they would use the buildings as nature boundaries as they do with Corn on the Curb, as well as softball fencing where they will be checking IDs.
