

Meeting Minutes

Special Public Protection Committee

Monday, June 26, 2006, 5:30 pm

1. Recommendation on license list:

Ald. Sevenich reviewed the items of the agenda.

Capt. Dowling stated apparently Noodles was under the impression that when they built the patio and they worked with the Inspection Department, that it was part of the licensed premises. The Council has acted on three premises extensions recently: the Rudy's Red Eye Grill, Olympic, and Rhody's. Conditions set for two of the three extensions included 6 foot fencing that would not allow things to be passed through. The third, the Red Eye Grill, does have fencing similar to Noodles; however, they do have a kiosk in that area which would be manned sometimes and the location of the business is in a different area so the Police Department had no problem going along with that. This one, since it is so close to what we had done with the Olympic, the fencing does not match up but it is a different type of establishment. The Department does not have a recommendation one way or the other.

Ald. Trzebiatowski moved, Ald. Barber seconded, approval of the New Operators, Renewal Operators, license lists. Ayes, all; nays, none. Motion carried.

Ald. Molski, returning to the extension of premises, said that she has gone by the area, the ice cream parlor next door has a lot of kids and it just doesn't seem to be a real good environment to have this other stuff being served outside.

Ald. Robinson asked Capt. Dowling what conditions would he recommend for Noodles to get a recommendation from the Police Department - was it just the fencing?

Capt. Dowling said it is a difficult situation, Noodles thought that they were in compliance when they built the thing, they worked with the Inspection Department. It would be difficult recommending this for approval, when across the street we set different conditions.

Ald. Trzebiatowski moved, Barber seconded, to run the Committee and Council meetings concurrently. Ayes, all; nays, none. Motion carried.
