1. Recommendation on license list.

Ald. Trzebiatowski moved, seconded by Ald. Barber, approval of the 35 New Operator licenses. Ayes, all; nays, none. Motion carried.

2. Request to close Fourth Avenue and Second Street for 20 minutes on Saturday, December 2, 2006, for annual YMCA Frostbite Road Race and Winter Walk.

Capt. Ruder said that the department has been in contact with the organizers and they do not have a problem with the event.

Ald. Sevenich noted that the route had changed due to road construction.

Ald. Slowinski moved, seconded by Ald. Robinson to approve the request to close Fourth Avenue and Second Street for 20 minutes on Saturday, December 2, 2006, for the annual YMCA Frostbite Road Race and Winter Walk.

Ald. Wiza asked if 20 minutes would be enough time.

Capt. Ruder stated the department blocks the intersection according to the number of runners. Initially there is a large group of runners where we would block the intersection for twenty minutes, then only stopping traffic as needed.

Ald. Wiza asked for clarification that only the intersection is closed and not the entire street.

Capt. Ruder replied that is correct.
