1. Recommendation on license list.
  - A. Operator's (Bartender's) Licenses.
  - B. Recommended Rejections.
  - C. "Class B" Combination License for CJ's Bar, 348 Second Street North.Ald. Sowieja moved, Ald. Markham seconded, for approval of (A) Operator's Licenses and (C) "Class B" Combination License for CJ's Bar. Ayes, all; nays, none; motion carried.

Rejections were considered individually. Ald. Sevenich moved, Ald. Wiza seconded, rejection of the application of Hannah Massman for failure to list underage alcohol violation and ID Card violation under oath. Ayes, all; nays, none; motion carried.

Ald. Rackow moved, Ald. Sowieja seconded, rejection of the application of Roberta Dettmering for two felony offenses of possession with intent to deliver. Ayes, all; nays, none; motion carried.

Ald. Wiza moved, Ald. Markham seconded, rejection of the application of Bradley Yach for failure to list underage alcohol convictions under oath. Ayes, all; nays, none; motion carried.

Jennifer Casey was present to appeal the recommendation of rejection. The Committee noted the alcohol conviction was in June of 2004. Ald. Rackow moved, Ald. Sevenich seconded for rejection of the application based on failure to list alcohol conviction under oath. Ayes, all; nays, none; motion carried.

Ald. Wiza stated he feels the application is very explicit, with "all convictions" in bold print and underlined. There should be no misunderstanding.

Ald. Wiza moved, Ald. Sevenich seconded, rejection of Rachael Adamski for failure to list a prior conviction under oath. Ms. Adamski was present and stated that she had previously received a license after conviction. It was pointed out that she had listed the conviction at that time. On this application, which is made under oath, she failed to list the conviction. The chair called for the vote: ayes, all; nays, none; motion carried.

Ald. Sevenich moved, Ald. Wiza seconded, the rejection of the application of Laura Kneebone for failure to list prior convictions under oath. Ms. Kneebone said she was 17 at the time and thought that as a juvenile the record would not be available, that the application referred only to convictions after age 18. On the vote: ayes, majority; nays, Sowieja; motion carried.

2. Commercial Animal Establishment license application.

Chairperson Rackow announced that this item has been withdrawn for further study.

3. Report of Deer Management Special Committee.

Ald. Rackow moved, Ald. Sevenich seconded, for acceptance of the report as presented. Ald. Markham questioned if the intent of the deer removal proposal submitted by Tom Jakusz was for antlerless deer only. Ald. Rackow said the proposal is for antlerless deer only and the contract would reflect that. He added that the DNR states that to be effective, culling must be done every year. He thinks this year's proposal is somewhat better than last year's. The committee will decide in January if a sharpshooter is needed to finish the deer culling.

Ald. Wiza said he has heard no complaints about last year, and feels it is a good program. He asked about tracking deer on private property. Ald. Rackow said archers must ask permission to track on private property. It is expected that Jakusz will get 65 antlerless deer.

Vote: Ayes, all; nays, none; motion carried.

4. Recommendation of the Inspection Report.

Ald. Sowieja moved, Ald. Wiza seconded, the acceptance of the Inspection Report to be put on file. Ayes, all; nays, none; motion carried.

5. Adjournment.
