1. Recommendation on license list.

A. Operators (Bartenders) Licenses.

Ald. Sowieja moved, Ald. Markham seconded, for approval of the new operators license list, except for one recommended rejection. Ayes, all; nays, none; motion carried.

B. Recommended rejection.

Ald. Sevenich moved to deny the application of Jennifer Lee Wyss because she failed to list an alcohol conviction while under oath. Ald. Wiza seconded the motion. Ayes, all; nays, none; motion carried.

**C. "Class A" Liquor and Class "A" Beer Licenses for Vikki L. Nason, LLC at Cheese Louise's Market and Café, 4928A Main Street.**

Chair Rackow announced that Ms. Nason has withdrawn her request for these licenses. No action was taken.

D. 6 month Class "B" Beer license for The Mission Coffee House, 1319 Strongs Avenue.

Ald. Rackow asked if the Police Department has had any contact for problems at this location in the past six months. The response was no contact has been made. Ald. Sevenich moved, Ald. Markham seconded, for approval of the six months license. Ayes, all; nays, none; motion carried.

2. Ordinance amendment - Application for Operator's License.

This ordinance would allow applicants for an Operator's license who omit information from their application to be notified and to submit a new form after a 30 day waiting period without Council action. Ald. Rackow moved, Ald. Sevenich seconded, for approval of the proposed ordinance. Ayes, all; nays, none; motion carried.

3. Ordinance - Interfering with Fire Fighting Equipment.

This ordinance was requested by the Police Department to bring city ordinances in line with State Statutes. Ald. Sowieja moved, Ald. Wiza seconded, for approval of the ordinance amendment. Ayes, all; nays, none; motion carried.

4. Report on deer culling.

Ald. Rackow reported that 47 of the 65 antlerless deer contracted for have been killed. A total of 25 deer have been culled at two locations on the north side of the city, nine along Green Avenue, 6 near the airport and 7 around McDill Pond. He said the list of people who would like a field dressed deer is short, and anyone wishing to have a deer may sign up at the City Clerk's office. Priority for deer is 1) city residents, 2) city property owners who live outside the city, 3) all others.

Ald. Wiza said he had attended the seminar demonstrating how to field dress a deer, and found it very informative. He has video taped the session and will make the tape available through the City Clerk's office or Channel 3 office.

5. Recommendation of the October 2004 Inspection Report.

A. Construction starts.

B. Violations.

Ald. Sevenich moved to accept the report and place it on file. Ald. Sowieja seconded the motion.

Director Gardner pointed out the new construction does not include the new Holiday Inn east of town. He also said the 44 citations issued for violations averages 2 per day, and has resulted in \$1,180 in fees.
