1. Canvass the municipal results and any late arriving absentee and provisional ballots for the April 1, 2014 Spring Election and correct any errors or irregularities as a result of such canvass.

The Canvass members were presented with the absentee ballot logs, poll books, each District's DS200 printouts, write-in tally sheets, and Inspectors Statements for review.

In District 8 the Canvass members struck two writes-ins as they were not real people.

Late Arriving Absentees:

Clerk's Office staff brought in the ballot container. Members confirmed the seal was intact and that it had not been tampered with. Members broke the seal on the container and noted that there were four late-arriving absentee ballots. The ballots were from Districts 2, 4, 7 and 11.

In District 2, the absentee ballot was reviewed and found to be eligible to be counted. The following candidates received a vote: Court of Appeals: Sherman, County Executive: Dreier, County Board: Suomi, City Council: Suomi, School Board: Kochanowski, Baker, Presley, Scott.

In District 4, the absentee ballot was reviewed and found to be eligible to be counted. The following candidates received a vote: School Board: Kochanowski, Baker, Presley, Scott.

In District 7, the absentee ballot was reviewed and found to have a postmark after the election. The ballot was rejected.

In District 11, the absentee ballot was reviewed and found to be eligible to be counted. The following candidates received a vote: Court of Appeals: Sherman, County Executive: Dreier, County Board: Presley, School Board: Kochanowski, Hetzel, Baker, Fink.

For city offices, the candidates with the highest votes are: Ald. Dist. 2: Joanne Suomi, Ald. Dist. 4: Mike Wiza, Ald. Dist. 6: Jeremy Slowinski, Ald. Dist. 8: Tony Patton, Ald. Dist. 10: Mike Phillips.
